## ATTENDANCE

- All athletes must dedicate and make proper arrangements to attend ALL team meetings, practices, and games.
  - Athletes that do not comply with missing **no more than three (3)** scheduled practices, meetings, or games may be dismissed from games for team participation entirely.
  - **PRACTICES** are held Monday-Wednesday, with games on Thursdays. If there is no game, there will be practice.

## GRADES

- All athletes must maintain at least a **2.5 GPA** in order to participate.
- Coaches may keep track of the athlete's progress in class, and may require the athlete to attend the afterschool program's homework hall if needed.
  - If student player falls below 2.5 GPA while on the team, possible consequences include dismissal from the team entirely, or dismissal from scrimmage participation.

## UNIFORMS/JERSEYS

- All athletes are required to attend practice fully prepared with proper sports clothing.
  - Sneakers, shorts, and short-sleeved shirts are required to participate in practice and games.
- The coaches will provide each team member with a uniform jersey, which the athlete is fully responsible for any damage or loss of their assigned jersey.

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## **SPORTSMANSHIP**

- All those involved and participating are expected to display and practice respect, good sportsmanship, and support to all coaches, team members, referees, and especially to our competing schools. Any display of disrespect or poor sportsmanship may result in scrimmage sit-outs or dismissal of team participation entirely.

## **UNSPORTSMANSHIP**

- **Coaches** - Any coach receiving a technical foul will be required to sit down on the bench for the remainder of the game.
- **Students** - Any player receiving an unsportsmanship technical foul will sit out eight (8) game minutes.
  - If a player or coach receives two (2) technical fouls in a single game, he/she will be ejected for the remainder of that game and the next game.
  - A meeting with the district representative, program coordinator, and coach is required before that player or coach is eligible to return to the league.
  - Three (3) unsportsmanship technical fouls accumulated during the season may result in being suspended for games and up to suspension or dismissal from league play.

## **SIDELINE BEHAVIOR**

- **PLAYERS, COACHES AND SPECTATORS** should keep all comments positive and supportive of the players and referees/officials
  - May be cautioned or sent off by the referee for behavior in **violation** of the Agreement Form by the team's staff, players or their respective spectator sidelines.
    - Players & Coaches are required to remain within their respective technical areas unless invited onto the field of play by the referees/officials.
    - Providing coaching instructions from outside of the technical area is not permitted.
- **SPECTATORS** should refrain from providing playing instructions to the players which should **ONLY** be done by the COACHING STAFF.
  - Only official team coaches/managers as listed on the game form may be in the technical areas and provide instruction to players.
    - **NO** referee abuse will be tolerated.
- **SEATING** Spectators shall be seated on the **opposite side** of their school's team from the must remain in the designated area and **off the court** at all times the.

## **COACH AND PLAYER CONDUCT**

- Coaches are responsible for the conduct of their players and fans
  - Only the captain is allowed to address an official during play
- Acts of unsportsmanlike conduct including unnecessary roughness, arguing with officials, fighting, abusive language directed towards officials/opponents will result in player(s) involved being ejected from the game.
  - Any player ejected from the game will automatically be suspended for a minimum of one contest.
  - Any player being ejected twice in a single season must meet with the league director before he/she may return to play. Team captains from other teams will be consulted on their opinion if that player should be allowed to return.

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## STUDENT PLAYER & SPECTATOR CONDUCT

- Students are high-profile representatives of their school. Students are expected to always act in an appropriate manner. The following behavior is inappropriate at all times and will not be tolerated:
  - Fighting
  - Profanity
  - Possession of, use of, or being under influence of alcohol, tobacco, or drugs
  - Unsportsmanlike conduct:
    - A. Any act of unsportsmanlike or inappropriate conduct will be dealt with swiftly.
    - B. If the act occurs during an athletic contest, the student will be removed from the contest.
    - C. A student who strikes, curses or threatens an official, coach, or opponent during a scrimmage or at any other time because of resentment over occurrences or decisions, or who fails to maintain a standard of conduct satisfactory to the school administration, may be deemed ineligible to participate in interscholastic athletics.
    - D. A student who is ejected from a contest for a flagrant foul or unsportsmanlike conduct may be prohibited from participating in any contest for a minimum of one week, or if no contests are scheduled during that week, the next contest.
  - Rude or disrespectful behavior toward any person (i.e. teacher, parent, coach, official)
  - Taunting opponents or official.
  - Destruction of property
  - Any act of which moral turpitude is in question (Internet, Cyber Bullying, etc...)
- Students who exhibit any of the above behaviors may be suspended from athletic competition for a period of time.
  - A student may also face school disciplinary action by administration.

## PARENT/GUARDIAN & SPECTATOR CONDUCT

- Everyone associated with an athletic event plays an important role in seeing that standards of sportsmanship are upheld. Fans are reminded that their sportsmanship and behavior reflects upon the reputation of their school.
  - **A Spectator should...**
    - A. Demonstrate good sportsmanship
    - B. Respect, cooperate, and respond enthusiastically to cheerleaders.
    - C. Censor fellow spectators who display negative behavior.
    - D. Respect the property of the school and the authority of school officials.
    - E. Never heckle, jeer, or distract members of opposing teams.
    - F. Never criticize the athletes or coaches for the loss of a contest.
    - G. Accept the decisions of the officials.
- Parents or spectators, who do not adhere to sportsmanship guidelines, may be removed from an athletic contest(s) for a period of time as determined by the school administration.
